Safety Update:

As you all know, the district is moving forward with plans for improving safety measures for the 18-19 school year. Here is what you can expect in the fall:

- Buzz in system at the front door. Our office configuration/design will change over the summer to accommodate a side door entry. This allows the front door to be locked all day. Patrons and parents will enter the side door during the school day.
- All building doors are to be locked during the day. Staff will use Key Cards to gain access to the building.
- Raptor check in system will continue in our office.
- Options Primary K-1 classroom will move into the B Pod. This move ensures that our youngest students are in the building and can use the restroom without the worry of walking by themselves between buildings or with an adult that has a keycard throughout the day.
- Fifth graders will move into the portables. To ensure safety, typically older students are placed in portables.
- Those students in portables will work with the incoming principal and administrators regarding the use of keycards during the day.
- All district staff and teachers will be trained in ALICE procedures. Parents will receive communication regarding these procedures and how they will be taught to students.
- Continue working with students and staff around building community and education around social emotional development to help further prevent student isolation, aggression and bullying behavior among youth.

In closing, it has been an honor to be a part of your child's education at Gordon. As bittersweet as it is to retire, it is my absolute pleasure to introduce your new principal, Mrs. Christine Frantzen.
